The writer of Hebrews is referring here to the time when Abraham was visited by the Lord himself and two angels, but didn't immediately realize it. (Genesis 18) It's a sobering thing to consider that people you meet casually might actually be angels in disguise, which is good reason to always engage in the practice of generous hospitality.

Beyond that, when you think about it, hospitality is at the heart of who God is; after all, he created the entire universe and specifically the earth itself as a beautiful and welcoming homeplace for those he created in his image. Every single day, through God's common grace poured out on all humanity, we are enjoying the hospitality of God. In turn, we should demonstrate our "family resemblance" by sharing hospitality with others. This goes beyond just being nice to people when they visit our church (which of course we should do joyfully). In this era, it seems our society is more fragmented than ever, and people are deeply alienated from one another, with fewer and fewer opportunities to experience a genuinely caring community. One simple solution is expressed in a book written by Rosaria Butterfield, entitled, The Gospel Comes with A House Key. She writes: "Let God use your home, apartment, dorm room, front yard, community gymnasium, or garden for the purpose of making strangers into neighbors and neighbors into family. Because that is the point - building the church and living like a family, the family of God...Radically ordinary and daily hospitality is the basic building block for vital Christian living. Start anywhere. But do start."




