Change! A lot of emotions come along with the changes in our lives. All changes, including those we look forward to and those thrust upon us against our wills, involve a variety of emotions. Anticipation, fear, joy, sadness, grief, anxiety, relief, hope, hopelessness; all these emotions play a part in how we view and approach change. Sometimes change is gradual, and we hardly notice it happening. Sometimes change hits us directly and shakes our very being.

But in the midst of our emotions revolving around change, we usually find the unexpected. This unexpected is where we discover, once again, the Holy Spirit at work.

Soon, I will be with you as your Transitional Pastor, a temporary contracted pastoral relationship as compared to a settled, installed pastoral relationship. In that role, I will work with you as we consider where we are as a congregation and where we hope to go. We will do this work with three underpinning “postholes” guiding us and our preparation for that which is to come.

1st Posthole: God has already been at work for years preparing our future Installed Pastor. We may not know who this person is, but God does. Our work will be about “perceiving” what God is revealing to us.

2nd Posthole: Even amid our “due diligence” there will be room for the unexpected where we will encounter God’s Spirit, God’s very presence. The Spirit may at times nudge us, push us, and/or pull us, in ways we cannot yet imagine. Here, we will discover the relationship between trusting and perceiving.

3rd Posthole: Throughout this time of transition and preparation and yes, change, we will continue the ministry and work of this congregation that has been your hallmark in the Augusta community for nearly five decades.

Linda and I look forward to being a part of this journey and digging these postholes with you. May God bless and keep us as we step into the “new thing God is about to do” at St. Andrew!
