"If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

(John 14:15)

Well, as the card, candy, flower, and jewelry companies are reminding us, Valentine's Day is this month, a time to express our devotion to the ones we love. And there's certainly nothing wrong with using any of those items as symbols of devotion. But what would you think of a man who showers his beloved with all those material gifts, yet never actually does anything loving for her? Or worse, suppose he is unfaithful in his relationship? Do you think any of those external, material things would mean anything at all?

I wonder if we ever stop and consider how we might be living unfaithfully in our devotion to Jesus Christ. We are rightly grateful for our salvation, which is ours through faith in him, but do we honor our union with Christ by truly living in ways that are pleasing to him? Each of us has areas in our hearts and minds and wills that are slow to be brought into submission to the Lord. For some, it's in things like gossip or having a short temper, and we excuse ourselves by saying, "well, that's just me," as though these were not to be taken seriously. For others, there are stubborn habits of seeking comfort, not in the Lord's presence and power, but in alcohol or drugs, or even things like food or video games.

For each of us, there are unconquered regions in our souls that we have refused to yield to Christ, and what we have to recognize is that the real test of our love for the Lord is simply being obedient to his word. We have to stop believing the lie that tells us life in Christ is not as good as the life we've figured out for ourselves, and finally say, in the words of a beautiful old hymn, "have Thine own way, Lord, have Thine own way."

The surprising truth is that obedience – following the commandments of Jesus – is what leads us into true freedom and peace, into the wholeness, the *shalom* of God that he has promised to those who are faithful to him. But this obedience must flow from faith and not fear, from gratitude and not begrudgingly; only then will we know the joy of the Lord that he has stored up for those he loves.

Ever wonder why there are already cars in the parking lot when you arrive for church on Sunday morning? People gathering before church to share fellowship and a chance to learn more about the Bible, faith and our Presbyterian faith. We have a class for everyone and every age!

For the very young, we have a fully staffed Nursery to care for infants through Pre-school to learn the Bible stories many of learned as our first exposure to the Bible. The Nursey is in the Ark and ready to welcome your children or grandchildren.

For Youth of all ages, there are classes in the Ark as well. Jackie Voss is the teacher. This year we are learning all about the Bible, starting with the Old Testament. In February we will be learning more about God's creations, people! We are also learning how much God loves us and how he keeps His promises.

There is a Co-Ed class for Adults in the Parlor led by Jim Elder. We Discuss the Bible selections selected for the Worship Service that week. (If you like, you can get a head start by reading the scripture in the bulletin that is emailed on Thursday for the Sunday Service.) It makes listening to the sermon more personal when we share our thoughts on what the scripture means.
