The main thing, obviously, is to make sure we can get our hands on whatever nick-nack, doodad, or gizmo is most popular this year.

There's not much in our culture that teaches us to be content with what we have. In fact, we are repeatedly told - through a non-stop barrage of advertising — that our lives will be empty and unfulfilled if we don't acquire whatever is newest, largest, and shiniest. Lost in the conversation is any reflection on what our income and possessions are meant to be for in the first place.


On the other hand, maybe we could see this as an opportunity to reset our expectations for what Christmas ought to be about. Maybe instead of overextending our credit in the annual consumer binge-fest, what if we saw this as the Lord giving us the chance to rediscover the meaning of "godliness with contentment"?

This applies to more than just the Christmas season. What if this time of apparent shortages could lead us into a new way of life? Instead of piling up more and more stuff, what if we focused on living simply, thankfully, and generously, as a way of expressing our trust in God who has promised to meet all our needs?

Jesus said, "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" (Matthew 6:26) Trusting in the Lord doesn't mean being foolish or lazy, but it does mean letting go of greed and covetousness. We really do have a lot to be thankful for; let's rest content with what we have, and joyfully share the Lord's bounty with others.
